I would like to do a quick recap of our 2016 Auxiliary year. I think it is good that we remind ourselves what a terrific job we all do.

Our fundraising year started in March with our annual Bake Sale then on April 29<sup>th</sup>, with preparations finally complete, we had our Red Wine and Lipstick Fashion Show which was very well attended, great fun and a financial success. June saw our annual

Strawberry Tea and Father's Day raffle. In the fall things got a little hectic with our 2nd Annual Craft Show in October, Poinsettia Sale and Soiree de Vin in November, our Ole St. Nick raffle and Breakfast with Santa in December. Wow, it's exhausting just listing it all. Total raised for these events was \$24,000.

Our gift shop and coffee shop both had a successful year. The coffee shop making over \$28,500 and our gift shop earning \$47,000. Our H.E.L.P.P. ticket sales raised \$2,500.00 and our Vendor program \$2,450.00. We were fortunate to be the benefactors of \$50,000 from the Rankin Run which was presented to us in November. All in all 2016 was a financial success.

Of course, throughout the year every volunteer contributed thousands of hours helping staff and patients in all areas. It's difficult to imagine what our hospital would be like without all of your help.

In 2016, we were able to complete our pledge to the hospital of a new laparoscopic tower for the OR, the purchase of pulmonary function testing equipment and an echocardiogram. In late fall of 2016, the auxiliary agreed to a new pledge to purchase a new bathing unit with lift for B Ward, a new portable digital x-ray machine and equipment for the new endoscopy suite which will be set up sometime in 2017. The total of our new pledge is \$193,000. We are happy to report that we are able to purchase the bathing unit immediately and it should be ordered and installed in the next couple of months.

We are starting 2017 with our Lasagne dinner held at St. Andrew's on Friday, February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2017. As you know this event is usually held in September, but this past fall was just too busy to do it, and I can't think of a better way to break up the winter blahs than having our dinner in February. Tickets are on sale for \$20 in the auxiliary office. Please plan to join us with your friends and family. Look for announcements and posters of upcoming events throughout the year. We need your support.

As my term as president is up in April this will be my last president's message. I must step back and become past president for the next two years. Although I am stepping back, I fully intend to remain very active in the auxiliary, so I'm not going far. You can't get rid of me that easily.
